1. Introductions, Welcome and Safety Moment

Alberta Municipal Health and Safety Association's Program Evaluation Manager, Shannon Thomas, welcomed everyone, introduced herself, and called the meeting to order at 10:01 am. Members, guests, and staff introduced themselves.

Shannon Thomas reviewed housekeeping items including recording of meeting but not roundtable, use of microphone and video, chat function, Chris available for technical support, etc.

2. HEALTH AND SAFETY MOMENT

3. WORKERS' COMPENSATION BOARD – ALBERTA UPDATE

Sanjeev Bhagarath presented on the features and function of the updated Fit-For-Work Dashboard. Sanjeev also introduced the Psychological Injury Dashboard which provides province-wide stats on psychological injuries.

WCB employer and employee handbooks have reverted to digital only effective May 1, 2022.

4. RUSA CONFERENCE

Shannon answered questions re: Virtual vs inperson presentations and attendance and highlighted the pre-conference AMHSA sessions — Contractor Safety Management (new) and Health and Safety Committees and Representatives (revised). The conference will also include an OHS Legislation Update, Psychological Injuries in the Workplace seminar from WCB, and opening and closing keynotes. An in-person tradeshow will also take place.

Katya presented on the UNB & AMHSA Partnership and available scholarship/tuition award. Scott drew Shawn Justus' name as the winner of the tuition award.

6. PARTNERSHIPS UPDATE

Miranda McLay - Government of Alberta, Partnerships Consultant

Ms. McLay presented the Partnerships update (attached in the PowerPoint) which included the following topics:

- Partnerships no longer printing physical copies.

COR and SECOR updates

- COR and SECOR audit criteria have been updated due to change in legislation and standards.
- New COR and SECOR tools are being created.
- Updates to training courses and new audit tools must be implemented by AMHSA by Jan1, 2023.

Auditor Notes

- Auditor Note Standard was updated.
- All questions require a quantification except for interviews done on an electronic tool.

Key Changes to the COR Audit Criteria

- Allowance of applicable legislation (Alberta or Federal) to be used to answer legislation questions.
- Hazard assessment review on predetermined frequency instead of regular basis
- Reduction in number of questions around Violence and Harassment.
- JHSC/HSR element updated to match legislation req.
- Self employed persons removed as now included under employer as per the OHS legislated definition
- Minimum requirement around cascade scoring

Key Changes to the SECOR Audit Criteria

- Allowance of applicable legislation (Alberta or Federal) to be used to answer legislation questions
- Hazard assessments reviewed on pre-determined frequency instead of regular basis
- Reduction in number of questions around Violence and Harassment to simplify the requirements
- Joint Health and Safety Committee/ Health and Safety Representative element updated to match new legislation requirements
- Self-employed persons removed as now included under employer as per the OHS legislated definition
- Minimum requirements around cascade scoring of questions
- Allowance of applicable legislation (Alberta or Federal) to be used to answer legislation questions
- Addition an element for Health and Safety Representative
- Addition of element around Other Employers
- No cascading of questions however, no sampling for the first 3 questions for hazard assessments
- Content aligned with Appendix B Regular COR audit where appropriate

SECOR Adapted for Owner/Operators

- A new definition for Owner/Operator was created with Certifying Partners and WCB.

2022/23 OSAR Year

- Target this year is 75 OSARs with 2 planned for AMHSA
- OSARs will be looking at interview data to ensure proper process/sampling completed
- Documentation review will be completed on 14 chosen audit criteria
- OSARs will be completed both on-site and off-site this year

2021/22 OSAR Results

- 3 OSARs were completed for AMHSA
- 82 were completed across all Certifying Partners
- 32% required follow up with the Auditor
- Main area was findings not verified
- 2nd highest area was incorrect audit process

OHS Allowance and Inter-Jurisdictional Recognition

- A new OHS allowance permitting work sites to use Confined Space Remote Monitoring System (CSRMS) technology came into effect on May 3, 2022. CSRMS technology allows workers in a confined space to be monitored remotely, meaning that the tending worker does not have to be physically at or near the confined space entrance.
- Two Inter-jurisdictional recognitions have recently been issued. See slide.

Searchable Legislation

- Search for workplace health and safety rules under the Occupational Health and Safety Act,
 Regulation and Code
- View, download, email, print and manage a custom 'handbook'
- Expected to be available later this month
- Does not have links to other documents referenced (ie. CSA Standards), however it is something they are considering when they do an upgrade.

Legislation Updates

- In the Fall of 2020 two technical working groups were formed to provide input on Parts 33, 36, and 37 of the OHS Code.
- Public engagement on proposed year one changes occurred in Spring 2021, and was presented as an online survey that ran from March 30 to May 10, 2021
- The changes will be finalized in 2022; stakeholders will be given time from when the changes are announced to when they come into force to allow them to prepare
