





- Loss ratios compare the claim costs of a group of employers to the WCB premium they pay
- COR holders as a group, out-perform non-COR holders by the following percentages (as measured by comparing loss ratios):
 - 30.6 per cent lower in 2019
 - 19.4 per cent lower in 2020
 - 22.5 per cent lower in 2021
 - 25.8 per cent lower in 2022
 - 26.8 per cent lower in 2023

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
New Employer Review

- Partnerships selects the employers based on the OHS Abstract
 - Minimum size is 20 workers
 - OHS Abstract score increased from 2022 compared to 2023
- 2024-25 Pilot with a total of 30 employers selected from 5 CPs
 - AASP, ACSA, CCSA, ESC and MHSA
- CPs meet with the selected employers and assist them to develop their own action plans to correct deficiencies
- Employers who do not complete their action plans may lose COR

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Occupational Health and Safety Code Review

- Alberta's workplaces have gone through many changes during the past 15 years and Alberta's government needs to make sure health and safety laws reflect modern workplaces
- The Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) Act requires government to publish a plan to review the OHS Code every three years
- The OHS Code review process includes technical review, policy and legal analysis, as well as engagement with stakeholders

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Drivers for OHS Code Review

- Improve outcomes while reducing administrative burden
- Simplify requirements and language, and remove duplication to improve clarity
- Evaluate if outcomes can be improved through performance-based requirements
- Update technical provisions to reflect current best practices for OHS
- Resolve inconsistencies or legal errors that impact the implementation of the legislation as intended
- Align the OHS Code with other provinces, where applicable

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2023-2024 OHS Code Review

- This year, the Parts on violence and harassment (Part 27), explosives (Part 33) and oil and gas wells (Part 37) were reviewed
- An online survey to obtain public engagement ran between February 20, 2024 and April 2, 2024

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Next Steps Code Review

- Cabinet Review Fall 2024
- Legislation Review Committee Fall 2024
- Ministerial Order Fall 2024
- Changes to Code into Force March 2025

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2023-2024 OHS Code Review - Part 27

- Currently employers must develop separate violence prevention plan, policy and procedures and harassment prevention plan, policy and procedures
- Changes are proposed to:
 - Make requirements easier to understand
 - Improve flexibility to tailor plans and procedures to reflect work site needs while maintaining health and safety outcomes
 - Consolidate requirements and remove duplication

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Future OHS Code Review

- Alberta's government plans to continue reviewing and updating the OHS Code.
- Please refer to the online plan to see which areas will be considered next.
- There will be future opportunities to provide feedback on OHS Code review.

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Future OHS Code Review

- The next phase of the OHS Code Review will focus on:
 - Part 4 (Chemical Hazards, Biological Hazards and Harmful Substances;
 - Part 36 (Mining);
 - Part 40 (Utility Workers Electrical); and
 - · OELs and Technical Standards
- Subject to Minister's approval

Trenching & Excavating Creative Sentencing







Overview

- · A worker who was constructing a berm for Syncrude at the Aurora mine near Fort McKay, drowned on June 26, 2021 when an excavator he was working on slid into water at the mine.
- April 8, 2024 Syncrude was fined \$390,000.
- David and Joan Lynch School of Engineering Safety and Risk Management submitted a proposal for creative sentencing with AMHSA mentioned as a supporting organization. .
- · The creative sentence was issued to enhance safe work practices for trenching, excavating, and adjacent work through the development of:
 - · A best practice guide for trenching and excavating
 - Development of a mobile app with a decision tree, job reminder checklist, best practice guideline and schematic of controls.

- · AMHSA is named as a support organization in the Syncrude Creative Sentencing order for Trenching and Excavating. This is a 2-Year project, ending December 2026.


